

Dual MSF/MSEQE (Master of Science in Finance / Master of Science in Econometrics and Quantitative Economics)

In general, the Dual MSF/MSEQE can be completed in 21 months. The student must be admitted to both the MSF program and the MSEQE program. University policy on dual degrees stipulates that a maximum of 50% of the credit hours for the program with fewer units may be counted toward both degrees. The MSF/MSEQE degree requires a total of 51 units.

In summary:

MSF Degree requirements: 36 units of coursework MSEQE Degree requirements: 30 units of coursework

However: 6 units of MSF coursework can be counted toward the MSEQE and

9 units of MSEQE coursework can be counted toward the MSF

Therefore, to receive the Dual MSF/ MSEQE degree, the following are required:

18 units of required MSF Investment Management track coursework (6 courses)

6 units of required MSF Investment Management track coursework to count toward both the MSF and MSEQE (2 courses)

3 units of elective MSF coursework (1 course)

15 units of required MSEQE coursework (5 courses)

3 units of required MSEQE coursework to count toward both the MSF and MSEQE (I course)

_6 units of elective MSEQE coursework to count toward both the MSF and MSEQE (2 courses)

51 Total Units

Coursework is comprised of: (Course names are provided next on the sample Plan of study)

18 units of solely MSF Investment Management track required coursework:

Fall I or 2 – FIN 516, FIN 521, FIN 522

Spring - FIN 514, FIN 525, FIN 526

6 units of required MSF Investment Management track counting toward both degrees:

Fall – FIN 524. 542

3 units of elective MSF coursework counting toward both degrees

15 units of solely MSEQE coursework:

Fall I - ECON 519, 501A

Spring - ECON 501C, ECON 522A

Fall 2 - ECON 522B

3 units of required MSEQE counting toward both degrees:

Fall - ECON 520

6 units of elective MSEQE S coursework
