

Rio Salado Community College Transfer Student Guide

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Important Information about Eller College Professional Admission

All students pursuing a Bachelor of Science in Business Administration (BSBA) through the Eller College of Management enter as Foundational Business Management (Main Campus) or Foundational Business Administration (Online Campus). They then apply for Professional Admission to continue in the Professional phase of the upper-division curriculum. The Professional Admission application may be completed concurrently while applying for transfer admission to the University of Arizona.

In preparation for Professional Admission, the following foundation business courses are required:

^{*}Business Communications: If a transfer student does not have an equivalent to BCOM 214 complete before earning Professional Admission, they will complete BCOM 315 in addition to BCOM 314R during the professional phase of Eller coursework.

The Eller College suggests Rio Salado Community College transfer students complete an Associate's of Business (ABUS)** and follow this recommended course sequence in preparation for Professional Admission:

^{**} ABUS is a recommended transfer degree pathway that incorporates Eller's Foundational course requirements. However, a student is NOT required to complete an AGEC-B/ABUS in order to apply to Eller. NOTE: Students can complete AGEC-B General Education courses in any order.

Work with Eller Academic Advisors to determine the best sequencing for your academic plan.

Eller College Professional Admission Application Process

All students who meet the Professional Admissions eligibility requirements are guaranteed admission to the Business Management Professional major (Main Campus). All other <u>BSBA majors</u> are competitive and selective through the Professional Admission application process.

To be eligible, students must meet all requirements by the <u>application deadline</u>. The Professional Admissions process occurs twice each year; students intending to start the professional coursework in Fall must apply for Professional Admission in January-February, while students intending to start the professional coursework in Spring will apply in August-September. Professional Admission application deadlines are strictly enforced and can be found on the <u>Eller website</u>.

To be a competitive applicant for Eller Professional Admission, applicants should focus on strong overall academic performance, coupled with extracurricular or professional leadership opportunities. The Eller Professional Admission application considers the following selection criteria:

Grade Point Average

- Applicants must have a minimum cumulative GPA of at least 2.75 on 12 or more completed graded UA units.
 - If an applicant has fewer than 12 units at UA, Eller calculates cumulative transferrable GPA using all attempted college-level coursework from all previous institutions attended. (i.e. if a transferable course did not transfer to UA due to a grade or D or F, it will still be figured into the Eller cumulative GPA; W grades are not included in GPA calculation).

• Foundation Coursework

- Foundation Business courses must be completed or the terminal course in each sequence may be inprogress while applying for Professional Admission. All foundational business classes must be completed with a transferable grade (C or higher) by the end of the regular semester in which the student is applying for Professional Admission.
- o Eller considers all graded attempts at foundation courses, including repeated courses.

- Note: Students may NOT complete required courses during the summer or winter following their application to be eligible to apply – you must wait to apply in the next application cycle.
- Applicants must have completed a minimum of 36 units of work acceptable to the University of Arizona and be on track to complete 50 units by the end of the semester in which they apply.

Interview

- Applicants must submit a professional resume and cover letter to be evaluated by interviewers.
- o Interviews are conducted by business professionals (Eller Alum or community members). The interview consists of a brief introduction, discussion of an ethics case, and behavioral questions related to the Eller College of Management learning outcomes.

To retain Professional Admission, by the end of the application semester, applicants must:

- Students must be admitted to the University of Arizona to effectively be enrolled into their upperdivision coursework by the start of the intended semester.
- Earn a C grade or higher for all in-progress transfer foundation business courses.
- Maintain Academic Eligibility with a cumulative GPA of a 2.0 or higher.

Checklist for Eller Professional Admission:

After being admitted to the upper-division professional phase through the Professional Admission process, <u>each major</u> is designed to be completed in 4 traditional semesters.

	 Students can return to the Professional Admission portal before the deadline to submit the Resume and Cover Letter. 					
	After submitting an application for Professional Admission, schedule a mandatory Professional					
	Admission Academic Advising appointment and provide the Eller Advisor with a copy of unofficial transcripts.					
	 Communicate if you have been awarded an <u>ABUS</u> and/or an <u>AGEC</u>. 					
	Prepare for the professional development portion of the Professional Admission process:					
	 Submit <u>Cover Letter and Resume</u> through eSMS Professional Admission portal. 					
	 Participate in an <u>Interview</u>. 					
	Await notification of Major and cohort assignment.					
	 Acceptance information will be sent via email to the email on file through the eSMS Professiona 					
	Admission portal.					
	Send official transcripts to University of Arizona at the end of your final semester at Rio Salado					
	Community College.
