Additional Graduation Requirements

Minor

Students are required to complete a minor or a double major. Minors are usually 18 or more units, and usually include 9 or more upper division units. Students must earn a 2.0 GPA or higher to graduate.

General Electives

Students may need general electives to reach 120 units/42 upper division units requirements. Case-by-case situation and depends on each student's progress.
