additional academic class prep sessions. Desire 2 Learn (D2L) is the Universities Learning Management System. You will gain access to D2L when you are registered in the course. Faculty will typically make their course available to you two weeks before class starts.

Program Time Commitment

As a rigorous program, Evening MBA professors expect you to prepare prior to class. In addition to scheduled class times, most students spend about 15-25 hours per week studying, doing homework, and preparing for the next class night. This may vary depending on the course type and/or material and your particular area of expertise. We know that you are busy working professionals and we are here to provide support and guidance throughout your journey. A tip: most successful program students try to complete schoolwork 1-2 hours per weeknight with a dedicated full day of school work on the weekend.

Supplies

Microsoft Office 2016 and Calculator

You will be required to have a laptop in the program. Also, note that you are expected to have Microsoft Office 2016 or newer. *Mac Users:* while most of the tools you will use will be Mac compatible, it is strongly encouraged that you partition your hard drive so that you may run MS Windows and use Excel and other programs in this format.

The Microsoft Office 365 software suite and other software licensing are available at no cost for UA students from the UA Bookstore with your NetID and password. Please go to <https://softwarelicense.arizona.edu/students> for information on how to download this software. You can also contact the bookstore at 520.621.8874 for assistance

You will also need a financial calculator for the finance portions of the curriculum. Please note that Smartphone financial calculator apps are typically not approved by professors for use on exams. Financial calculators are very common and should be available where most calculators are sold. Used financial calculators can often be found on Amazon or EBay at significant savings. We recommend you purchase one of the following two calculators, as they are

Course Materials

Course materials such as textbooks, articles, and case studies will be provided to you.

Textbooks will be provided to you through D2L. Textbooks provided through D2L are electronic versions. You will be given the option to opt-out and purchase your own material if you choose. Hard copy texts will only be provided if an electronic version is not available.

A recent change to the United States Department of Education regulations, effective July 1, 2016, requires that students enrolled in all-inclusive programs be allowed the option to procure course materials on their own and receive a credit for the cost that the program would have incurred for those materials. This opt-out choice will give you the option of procuring the textbook on your own.

As you make this decision, please consider that when the program procures the course materials you are assured of the following:

- Course materials are obtained at or below market rates, discounted for institutional or volume pricing.
- Course materials are guaranteed to be the correct version for the course.
- Course materials will be available on or before the first day of each course providing convenience to you and ensuring you have the materials needed to succeed in the course.

What action must you take? For hard copy textbooks, prior to the start of each course, an email will be sent with details of the required textbook, decide if you will take the textbook provided or purchase it on your own. If you would like the textbook no action is needed. If you would like to purchase the textbook on your own, please respond to the email as specified to opt-out.

For electronic textbooks, information on the textbook will be available in D2L on the first day of class. Decide if you will take the electronic textbook or purchase it on your own. If you would like the electronic textbook no action is needed. If you would like to purchase the textbook on your own please opt-out in D2L. The cost that the program paid for the book will be credited to your bursar's account. It is then your responsibility to purchase the textbook in time to meet course requirements. Please note that faculty will not make

exceptions or extend deadlines for students that have not acquired the correct textbook in a timely manner.

If you prefer hard copy texts, we recommend opting out and purchasing them on your own. These can be purchased through the UA Bookstore, Amazon, and other textbook retailers.

Course materials such as articles and case studies will be available to you via D2L, a web-based course management system used by Eller Evening MBA. D2L is also available through the Arizona app for both Apple and Android. More information on D2L will be available during the technology session at Launch.
